ADORATION: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on First Fridays from 9:30 a.m. until Benediction at 9:30 p.m.

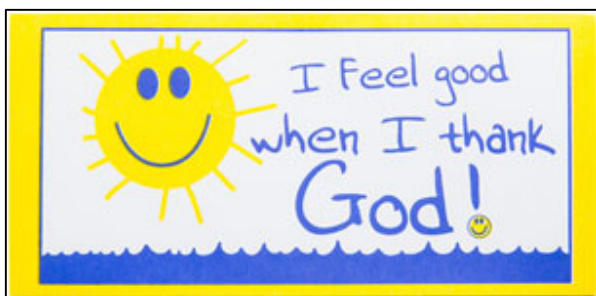

Parents/Guardians of First Communion candidates need to be present with the candidates at class that day.

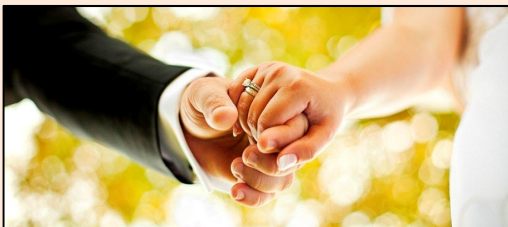
CONFIRMATION
