- What a blessing and joy it is to celebrate the Christmas season as Catholics! For much of society, lights are coming down by the strand, and trees are being pulled to the curb or packed away with the ornaments and nativity sets. Christmas Day has come and gone, and the focus has shifted....

As Catholics , not only do we have Christmas Day: we have 12 days of Christmas leading to the Baptism of Our Lord on January 8, and some will keep Christmas all the way until February 2 with the Feast of the Presentation (also called 'Candlemas'). In between, we remember the Holy Family, the Motherhood of Mary, and the arrival of the Magi at the Epiphany. So much packed into this season to decorate our lives with and to keep focus on the meaning and the reason of Christmas!

Perhaps as we look to keeping Christmas, we might consider our New Year's Resolutions. If you've already made one, does it keep Christ in better focus for 2018 as an individual, as a family, as a Catholic? ADORATION: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on First Fridays from 9:30 a.m. until Benediction at 9:30 p.m.



MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Our diocesan policy requires the parish priest be contacted at least six months prior to the *proposed* date of the couples' wedding to schedule preparation catechesis.
