From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Here there is a change. You have a new Pastor. You listen to a new voice, may be with a little bit of change of accent in English. Whether we like it or not, life is full of changes. Some changes are easy, fun and may be helpful. Attempting a new hair style, learning a new skill, etc. are comfortable for us. Some changes challenge us-giving up a bad habit, losing weight or adjusting our attitudes in the right way, etc. Prophets were agents of change. Throughout the centuries, Saints introduced change with new styles of prayer and service. Change can actually lead to spiritual growth. The question is how to work through the change to find that spiritual benefit.

In this first letter I like to introduce myself. I belong to a Religious Order called Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (C.M.I) founded by Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara. I subsequently served as Associate Pastor and Minor Seminary Rector. I have a Post Graduate degree in Education and History. I was a teacher in a Public High School and Principal of a High School in India. From 2010 to 2014, I was Associate Pastor of St. Teresa Parish in Glennonville, Missouri and St. Ann Parish in Malden, Missouri. From 2014 to 2018 I served as pastor at sacred Heart Parish, Bolivar and Saint Catherine of Sienna Parish, Humansville.

My father died when he was 92 and my mom is 101 now. I have one brother and three sisters. This is the first time I am the pastor of a parish who is my patron saint. I consider it as a great blessing. Fr. Scott is a dedicated pastor with a great responsibility as the vocation Director of our Diocese. As he departs our parish, with grateful hearts let us thank God for all the blessings that we received through his ministry in our parish and continue to pray for him.

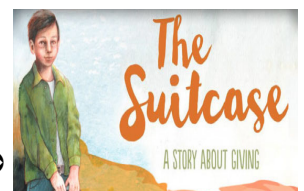
